



International Acclaim for West Australian Shiraz

MadFish Wines from Western Australia has once again received international acclaim at the prestigious San Francisco International Wine Competition, collecting a Gold medal for its newly released 2004 MadFish Shiraz.

The competition now in its 22nd year attracted 3800 entries from a record number of countries, making it one of the largest and most comprehensive wine competitions held in the United States.

The competition is judged by top wine industry professionals and internationally recognised journalists and writers including Anthony Dias Blue from Blue Lifestyle and Patrick Comiskey from Wine & Spirits Magazine, Los Angeles.

The 2004 MadFish Shiraz was the only Western Australian Shiraz to be awarded a Gold medal in its class.

"This is a fantastic result for MadFish, with the competition being one of the United State's largest and most respected wine shows where our wines are judged against the world's best. Our Gold medal win also confirms the strengthening appeal of high quality Western Australian Shiraz," said owner Amy Burch.

In addition to the Gold medal for the 2004 Shiraz, MadFish also received a Bronze medal for its 2004 MadFish Sauvignon Blanc and 2004 MadFish Cabernet Sauvignon Shiraz.

MadFish received a Double Gold medal for its Aboriginal inspired label at the same competition in 2005.
