



INTERNATIONAL GOLD FOR WEST AUSTRALIAN WINE

Western Australia's MadFish Wines continues to expose the strengthening appeal of high quality Western Australian Shiraz on the world stage, collecting its second international Gold Medal for the 2004 MadFish Shiraz.

The 2004 MadFish Shiraz was last week awarded a Gold Medal at the 2007 MUNDUSvini Great International Wine Awards in Germany, which follows a Gold Medal win at the 2006 San Francisco International Wine Competition in October last year.

The MUNDUSvini Awards have become the most important wine competition in Germany and the largest wine tasting event organised by the Organisation Internationale de la Vigne et du Vin (OIV) and International Association of Enology worldwide. The 2007 Awards attracted a total of 4925 wines from 35 countries, with gold medals awarded to the best 429 wines submitted.

The 2004 MadFish Shiraz is derived from grapes from Western Australia's South West region and was matured in French Oak for 12 months.

Senior Winemaker Tony Davis has this to say about the 2004 MadFish Shiraz and its recent Gold Medal win:

"This wine shows great depth of ripe cherry flavours with complex peppery characters. The wine displays the sweet fleshy fruity middle palate that makes good cool climate Western Australian Shiraz so attractive. We are very proud of this second Gold Medal win for the MadFish Shiraz, which reveals to the rest of the world the level of quality of Western Australian cool climate Shiraz."
